America: One Nation Under God?

Is America truly "one Nation under God?" Do we really believe in and practice the slogan "In God we trust?" Are we really a Christian Nation? Are we the "City on a Hill"? Boyd called "The Myth of a Christian Nation." Would Christ condone our use of power, violence, racism, trade wars and manipulation to control the world? Gregory Boyd says in his book, "AS WE HAVE NOTED, MANY CHRISTIANS BELIEVE THAT AMERICA IS, OR AT least once was, a Christian nation. We have argued that this notion is inaccurate for the simple reason that Christian means "Christlike," and there never was a time when America as a nation has acted Christlike. Indeed, we have argued that it's impossible for any version of the kingdom of the world to be Christlike for the simple reason that they participate in a system of domination that necessarily places its trust in the power of the sword. It may use this power in just or unjust ways—and we should certainly do all we can do to influence the former and resist the latter—but in neither case can it be said to be acting like Christ.

The kingdom of God, which always looks like Jesus, is not simply an improved version of the kingdom of the world, for a version of the kingdom of the world may be relatively good, but it cannot be beautiful. In my opinion, nothing has been more damaging to the advancement of the beautiful kingdom in America, and to a significant degree around the globe, than this myth that America is a Christian nation." Sick and Tired of Being Sick and Tired: The Life and Times of Fannie Lou Hamer

Fannie Lou Hamer often said that she was "sick and tired of being sick and tired" living in a land where Civil Rights and Human Rights were all but non-existent for Black people in Mississippi and the United States! Maegan Parker writes in the introduction of her book about the amazing Fannie Lou Hamer, "I never thought in a million years that Fannie Lou Hamer would be on a postage stamp," Vergie Hamer Faulkner exclaimed as the United States Postal Service included her mother among the twelve civil rights pioneers honored in celebration of the NAACP's one hundredth anniversary. The previous week, on February 17, 2009, the International Slavery Museum recognized Hamer as a "Black Achiever," hanging a portrait of her in their permanent exhibit next to one of President Barack Obama. For many, placing Hamer's portrait next to Obama's made good sense—during his 2008 Presidential campaign, national commentators pointed out that Obama's successes were made possible by the forerunning dedication of activists like Hamer. Her tireless advocacy of voting rights was also recognized in 2006, when Congress named the reauthorization of the 1965 Voting Rights Act after Fannie Lou Hamer, Rosa Parks, and Coretta Scott King. A decade earlier, Bill Clinton invoked Hamer's trademark refrain, "I'm sick and tired of being sick and tired," to roaring applause when he accepted the Democratic Party's 1992 presidential nomination."
