Worship Committee Team

Have you ever wondered what happens behind the scenes with the Worship Committee?

Here's a look at how they function in the church...

The Committee is responsible for preparing First Sunday Communion on either the last or the first Saturday of the month. They help with Baptisms, Baby Dedication services, preparation for Resurrection and Christmas Sunday, and preparing food on the First Sunday every other month for the Ministers.

The Worship Committee is always looking for dedicated volunteers. Members joyfully serve under the leadership of President Carol Williams, VP Charles Galloway, Secretary Frances Winford, Chaplain Minister Patty B Allen, Bap-Minister Counselor Thurston Ball, and Spiritual Advisor Minister Darian Woodruff.

This team of dedicated members continues to fulfill NCC's mission:

"To attract and win MEMBERS, develop them to CHRISTLIKE MATURITY and empower them for a meaningful MINISTRY in the church and a life MISSION in the world in order to MAGNIFY GOD."

Worship Committee Spotlight

This time of 'lockdown' has not stopped the committee's work. To ensure Holy Communion was available to us on Resurrection Sunday, the committee organized a 'drivethru' Communion pickup the day before. All who participated were able to stay in their cars and safely receive preassembled Communion kits to take home.

Many thanks to the Committee for a well-organized event and for helping to keep Resurrection Day 2020 most Sacred!

For Baptisms, which are held every 3rd Sunday, with the exception of Resurrection Sunday and Christmas, the Committee schedules candidates for pre-Baptism counseling with Minister Thurston Ball.

Sessions are held on the 2nd Sunday of the month from 8:30am to 9:30am in Amos Hall and include a visit to Founders Chapel. Here they view the baptism font where the water is held, are advised of the appropriate garments for male and female candidates, and are encouraged to invite their family and friends to witness the ceremony.

After a message from Minister Ball on what this day symbolizes and what publicly proclaiming your new life in Christ means, the session closes in prayer.

On Baptism Day, women candidates are baptized by Minister Patty B Allen and men are baptized by Minister Ball or Minister Barry Harris.

Each new partner receives a

"Certificate of Baptism" signed by the minister performing the Baptism.

The Worship Committee meets every 3rd Saturday of the month to discuss Baptism counseling, upcoming events, such as the Ministry Fair, as well as upcoming and previous baptisms.

As President for the past two years, Carol has served faithfully ensuring all the needs for baptism and communion are made available for the team, and information is provided on all current activities within the group and the church. The committee prides themselves on everything being done decently and in order.

Carol stated, "Being a part of this committee has taught me how to be a better leader. And with the assistance of Minister Patty B. I have learned to be a more compassionate and patient person."

Carol wants NCC Partners to know that the Worship Committee is a very dedicated and hard working group of people. "Everyone in our group belongs to one or two other ministries, but we are committed to excellence and making sure the Worship Committee does not fall short."

Lakesha has been Connections Manager for six and a half years. In this role, she coordinates with and supports the activities of over 40 ministries and auxiliaries. Without the Resurrection, the world would be in chaos and darkness.


